All Countries - VeForms

DLM 300 brings VeForms functionality. VeForms enable the design of documentation, assessments, referrals and general data entry forms.

Data can be written back to Consultation Manager automatically or, for data that has no Read code, it can be stored as part of the PDF attachment. Calculations can be written into VeForms and they can also be passed around within a practice to enable multiple staff input.

England - Bowel Cancer Screening

Practices in England are now able to receive electronic Bowel Cancer Screening (BCS) messages in Mail Manager. The messages contain Faecal Occult Blood Test results and are sent via the EDIFACT Laboratory Service.

Scotland - eCMS

The Electronic Chronic Medication Service (eCMS) is available to Scottish practices from DLM 300. This scheme, which is part of the Tranche 4 requirements, allows CMS therapy items to be sent electronically from Vision to the Community Pharmacy (CP), where all subsequent dispensing events can be managed. eCMS is similar to eAMS (electronic Acute Medication Service), but eCMS involves printing a single eCMS GP10 for multiple dispensing events.

Scotland - Priority Amend

Priority Amend is available from DLM 300. This allows the priority number of existing medical history data, which matches the SCIMP list of important Read codes, to be changed to a priority 1. This means that medical history data can be standardised and subsequently included in the data flow to external systems i.e. SCI and ECS.

Consultation Manager Changes

Prostate Cancer Risk Management Programme Link

From DLM 300, from the Links tab in Consultation Manager you are now able to access the NHS Prostate Cancer Risk Management Programme (PCRMP) website.

PCRMP aims to ensure that male patients who enquire about testing for prostate cancer are provided with clear and balanced information about the benefits and limitations of the PSA test.

- 1. In Consultation Manager, select a patient.
- 2. Click on the Links tab Links. If you do not have a Links tab, see Consultation Manager on-screen help.
- 3. From the dropdown list, select NHS Prostate Risk Management Programme.
- 4. You can now access the PCRMP website. From here, you can download and print the current information pack which contains:
 - A booklet.
 - A summary card for use when counselling the patient.
 - Patient information sheets for the patient to take home following the consultation.

Summary Care Record – Changes to Medication

Vision will now automatically include active problems in the Summary Care Record. This is so that medication review dates for medication linked to problems are maintained.

Note - Only Problems which have Read codes are included in the SCR.

This process will only apply to patients who have consented to the transmission of non-critical data. You are also able to manually exclude problem headers before the SCR is sent.

Recall Changes

Recalls generated from General History and Procedure, Specimen and Samples SDAs will **no longer** auto complete when a new recall is added.

Temperature Structured Data Area Validation

The value entered in the Temperature - Add Structured Data Area (SDA) must now be between 30 and 45, or blank. It is still acceptable to leave the value field blank and just use the Result Qualifier.

If a value other than between 30 and 45 is entered, the following error message will display:

Immunisation Contraindications and Consent Read Codes

The range of Read codes that can be used within Immunisation Contraindications and Consent has been extended to include the following Read codes:

Immunisation Contraindications:

- 8I2d.00 Pandemic influenza vaccination contraindicated.
- 8I2e.00 Hepatitis B vaccination contraindicated.
- 8I2f.00 Human papilloma virus vaccination contraindicated.

Immunisation Consent:

- 68Np.00 No consent for human papillomavirus vaccination.
- 68Nq.00 Consent given for human papillomavirus vaccination.
- 68Nr.00 Consent given for pandemic influenza vaccination.
- 68Ns.00 No consent for influenza A (H1N1v) 2009 vaccination.
- 8IAG.00 Pandemic influenza vaccination declined.

Note - **816g.00 Pandemic influenza vaccination not indicated** is still recorded under Medical History entry.

Pneumococcal Conjugate Prevenar 13

As part of the childhood immunisation programme, Pneumococcal conjugate Prevenar 13 can now be selected from the Immunisation SDA.

Depending on the stage selected, Pneumococcal conjugate Prevenar 13 is recorded as one of the following Read codes:

Drug Check Flags

Drug contraindication flags now have different shaped icons:

- **P** = No contraindications exist.
- \mathbf{P} = General warnings exist for contraindications.
- Patient specific contraindications exist.

Current Therapy Keyboard Shortcut

There is now a keyboard shortcut to **Current Therapy** - Press the **Control** key then press **R**.

Supplementary and Independent Prescribers - Private Prescriptions

Supplementary and Independent Prescribers can now prescribe private Therapy. This includes:

- Community Practitioner Nurse Prescribers.
- Nurse Supplementary Prescribers.
- Nurse Independent Prescribers.
- Pharmacist Supplementary Prescribers.
- Pharmacist Independent Prescribers.

Controlled Drugs – Northern Ireland

Supplementary and Independent Nurse Prescribers in Northern Ireland can now prescribe controlled drugs.

Searches and Reports Changes

Omission of Inactive Repeats from some Patient Reports

In the Search and Reports module, the following Patient Reports no longer include Inactive Repeat Masters.

• Encounter Report.

- Health Check Card.
- Home Visit Report.
 Full.

You can still search on inactive repeat masters from an Ad-hoc Search.

Searching for Batched/Repeat Dispensed Therapy

In Search and Reports, you can now specifically search for batch repeat masters (also referred to as Repeat Dispensing) and items issued from a batch repeat. For Scottish practices, if you have CMS enabled, this means you can search on CMS masters and CMS items

Searching for Items Issued from a Batch Repeat

To search on items issued from a batch repeat:

- 1. In Search and Reports, open an Ad Hoc search and build your criteria as required.
- 2. Add the Acute and Repeat Issue Therapy entity to your search.
- 3. Click on the Acute and Repeat Issue Therapy entity and click on **Selections**.
- 4. From the **Criteria Select** list, double click on **Issue Type**, then click on **Add New**.
- 5. In the From box, enter **B** to search on items issued from a batch repeat master. To search on items issued from a normal repeat master (i.e. not a batch item), enter **I** in the From box.

Searching for Batch Repeat Masters

To search on batch repeat masters:

- 1. In Search and Reports, open an Ad Hoc search and build your criteria as required.
- 2. Add the Repeat Masters entity to your search.
- 3. Click on the Repeat Masters entity and click on **Selections**.
- 4. From the **Criteria Select** list, double click on **Type of Repeat**, then click on **Add New**.
- 5. In the From box, enter **B** to search on masters prescribed as a batch. Or enter **R** to search on repeat masters not prescribed as a batch repeat.
