HPA Seasonal Flu Audits 2010-2011

New versions of the HPA Seasonal Flu Reporting Audit 2010-2011 will be automatically delivered in the upgrade SIS10050. The audits will be auto installed by generation of Clinical Audit.

The accompanying Call & Recall audit and Claims audit for the HPA Seasonal Flu 2010-2011 can be downloaded from the INPS website (<u>www.inps.co.uk</u>) from My Vision – Clinical Audits – HPA. This helps you find the eligible patients for invitation.

Changes in SIS 10050

There were changes to last year's HPA/HPS Seasonal Flu uptake report in DLM297 for 2010-11.

The changes for automatic reporting in this release (SIS10050)(Autumn 2010) are <u>for Scotland only</u> as English practices are still not submitting the report automatically to the HPA. The audits are being deployed, however, to all countries.

HPA (England):

- In England there are two monthly returns for the end of October 2010 and the end of January 2011, submitted manually to Immform.
- the Survey report XML document has some minor changes,
- there are some new and removed reported values for pregnancy and diabetes medication. The new audit reflects this.
- New reporting schedule.

HPS (Scotland):

- Data is extracted weekly from the audit automatically in <u>Scotland</u>, and relayed to the Health Protection Scotland.
- HPS require a different schedule: Monthly: Oct, Nov, Dec, Jan, Feb, Mar; and Weekly: Extended to week 12, 2011

New bounded code list

Note that this release also includes a new bounded code list.

Summary of Changes in the 2010-2011 audits

These changes refer to both the Call & Recall audit and the Reporting audit.

- Amended HPA Seasonal Influenza 2010-2011 Call and Recall and Claims audit. These two audits can be downloaded from the INPS website My Vision Clinical Audits HPA.
- Amended Seasonal Flu Vaccine Uptake Reporting. Scotland will report automatically each week. England will report manually at the end of October 2010 and end of January 2011 to Immform.
- See Ages and dates of birth for Seasonal Flu monthly returns on page 9.
- See Criteria for 2010-2011 Seasonal and Swine Flu vaccines on page 11.
- The Call and recall seasonal flu audit now uses the same criteria to calculate the age of the under/over 65y group as the reporting audit.
- CKD coding this has changed. Patients must have a CKD diagnosis code and their LAST stage record must be stage 3-5.
- There are additional Read codes in the clinical risk groups. These are listed below.
- The seasonal flu audit has had a small new section added which finds children aged 6m-12y at risk who are receiving the seasonal flu vaccination for the first time they need 2 doses.
- The list of Pregnancy codes for seasonal flu on page 8 has changed in several categories for seasonal flu audits. There has also been a change in the way both Reporting and Call & Recall find pregnant patients.
- (1) Reporting: the FIRST pregnant code between 1/9/2010 and January 2011 (eligible for H1N1 vaccination last season) must be recorded on or after 1/9/2010.
- (2) Call and recall: a patient pregnant code (using new codes on spec) recorded since 01/01/2010 and NOT superseded by a delivered code (same codes as used in previous call and recall audit), OR a pregnant code recorded on or after 01/09/2010. Hence the V2 call and recall audit does not include reference to ambiguous codes anymore and uses the new pregnancy codes.

65 years or older by the 31 March 2011 are eligible to receive vaccine in the 2010/11 vaccination programme). In a change from last season, the 6 month age band in no longer fixed as those born on or before 1 April – it too is now defined by age on the date of extraction.
